

See, Link, Wonder is a simple question and discussion tool to encourage your students to make observations and personal connections with an experience. It inspires curiosity and will help to get them thinking and talking about a topic.

Used with any object, image or even a hands-on experience, the questions help to generate a discussion which invites your students to explore and find their own links between what they see or do and their curriculum science and everyday lives.

Every student's view will be unique, and there are no wrong answers. This helps to build students' confidence to talk openly about what they see and what interests them.

These questions are just a starting point to inspire you and your students to generate more of your own.

Follow your curiosity and use your observation skills

What do you notice first?
Does it look like anything you've seen before?
What clues are there nearby to help you work out what it is?

Make connections with your personal knowledge and experiences

What interests or surprises you about it?
How do you think it might work?
What would your life be like if it hadn't been discovered or invented?

Keep following your curiosity

What would you like to know about it?
How could you find out more about it?
What would you tell someone else about it?
