

See, Link, Wonder is a simple question and discussion tool which invites and encourage your students to make observations and personal connections with an experience. It inspires curiosity and will help to get them thinking and talking about a topic.

It can be used with any object, image or even a hands-on experience, the questions help to generate a discussion which invites your students to explore and find their own links between what they see or do and their curriculum science and everyday lives.

Everyone's view will be unique, and there are no wrong answers.

These questions are just a starting point to inspire you to generate more of your own.

**Follow your curiosity and use your observation skills to describe what you see...**

What do you notice first?

How big or small is it?

Try looking sideways, or upside down...

What do you see that you couldn't see before?

**Make connections with what you already know...**

Does it look, smell, sound or feel like anything that you've seen before?

What do you find interesting or surprising about it?

If you were the object, how would you move?

**Ask questions to find out more...**

If you could ask it a question, what would you ask?

How do you think it might work?

What would you tell someone else about it?

Where could you find out more about it?
